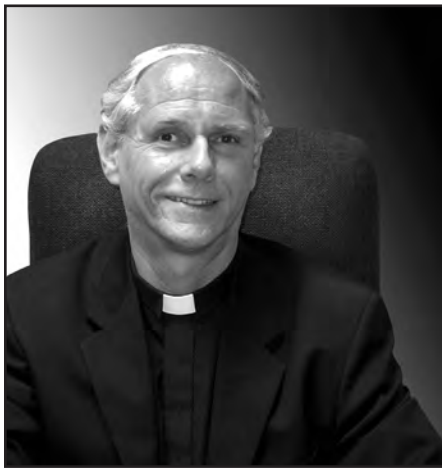

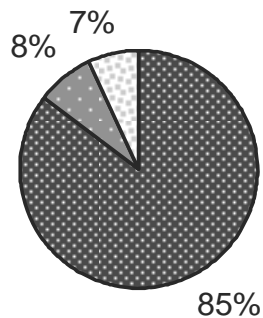

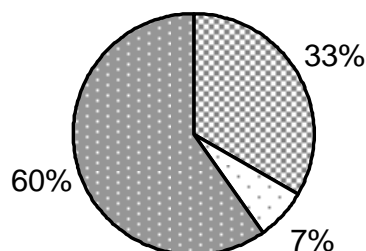

**Church Historian** A brief history of Sangre de Cristo Catholic Community is as follows. The parish was established in May, 1972. Mass was held at various places, including a cafeteria, and the chapel at Gate of Heaven Cemetery. In 1977, the Evangel Temple Church was purchased. We shared the church with them until their new church was built in 1978. The first pastor was Fr. Spencer Stopa. He was followed by Fr. Alan Cushing, Fr. Charlie Brown, Fr. Gregory Carroll, Fr. Albert Podvin, and our present pastor, Fr. Robert Lancaster. Our deacons are Deacon Lloyd Martinez, Deacon Paul Ortwerth and

Deacon Rudy Baca. Deacon Lloyd has been here for 38 years—ever since the beginning.

The first and, to date, only member to become a priest was Fr. Clement Bradley Niggel. He was ordained by Archbishop Michael Sheehan in June, 2003.

The Community Building was built in 1987. The renovation of the church was completed in June, 2009. The Church Blessing Mass by Archbishop Michael Sheehan, was held on June 22, 2009.

At the present time there are about 900 families in the parish.—*Mary Kinney*

**Extraordinary Ministers of the Eucharist to the Home bound**

What is an extraordinary minister of Holy Communion? He or she acts as an extraordinary minister of Holy Communion because the Priest or Deacon cannot meet the needs of all Catholics within the Parish area.

Our Parish boundaries are to the North—Spain, South—Candelaria, West—Wyoming and East—Juan Tabo.

Within these boundaries, we have one retirement home and three nursing homes: Bear Canyon, Morris and Lagrima de Oro.

We provide Communion and Rosary four Fridays month by an Acolyte, and one Communion Service on the third Friday by a Deacon.

† At Free Care Living Juan Tabo Circle NE, we provide Communion Service by an Acolyte on Mondays.

† At 10101 La Vida Llena Lagrima de Oro Nursing Home, we provide Communion Service Sundays by a Deacon and Mass on the second Wednesday a month.

† At Canyon Transitional Rehabilitation Center at 10101 Lagrima de Oro NE, we provide Communion two Thursdays a month by an Extraordinary Minister and one Communion Service by a Deacon.

† For Communion to the Home Bound, three Extraordinary Ministers once a week.

Our personal relationship with God, Father, Son, and Holy Spirit leads to the Beatitudes. God calls each one of us into knowledge of them simply in order to love us and live with us. To be submissive to the will of God simply means to let God be who they want to be for us. Do not be afraid any longer it has pleased God to give you the Kingdom.

Leading a normal life of the Christian is to experience God in the Beatitudes. First are those which are from outside to inside. Let us pray for an attitude of a child to his father who wants to give us good gifts.

### **1. Blessed are the poor on Spirit for theirs is the Kingdom of God.**

Conceived in the flesh we are descendants of a fallen people in a fallen world. This realization is enabling for while we can say I repent and will never sin again not in a thousand years we know we

cannot do it naturally. This is what Jesus is for, to bring us Home and undo the works of the devil. He gives us salvation by forgiveness and remission of sins. That is, he rebuilds us from above. When we let Him into our heart and soul, he brings the Holy Spirit with him. The power, the peace he gives to us in this beatitude is worth all. We depend on him.

**2. Blessed are they, who mourn, they will be comforted.** The first promise of our new creation is a new heart, not a stony hard heart but a new natural heart. This heart grieves over evil, and suffering, and death. God's presence assures us that they also share with us our mourning. The consolation of God's love and understanding makes all things possible, even our love and understanding.

**3. Blessed are the meek, for they shall inherit the land.** We can be assured that all insights and promises will be fulfilled. God often reveals something important for us in this life. We are not to go ahead as though by our demand magic will happen. Jesus goes before us preparing our way. We should follow Him, not our own wandering desires, then when we are prepared and ready it will come about naturally. Thus we wait on God and reverence the process.

## Let's ASK!

### **What is an indulgence?**

The Church recognizes that our actions have consequences and God holds us responsible for them. There is no sin that cannot be forgiven by God, except the sin of rejecting forgiveness. Being forgiven by God removes the spiritual, culpable element of sin. There remains a temporal element, a real world effect that in justice needs to be accounted for.

An indulgence is a pardon administered by the Church, as the minister of redemption, for all or some of the punishment. It is either plenary or partial, that is, it frees a person from all or from some of the temporal punishment due to sins. It may not be applied to other living persons, but can always be applied to the souls in purgatory.

Participation in the sacrifice of the Mass and the sacraments is not enriched by any indulgences. The sacraments are far more potent in sanctifying and purifying people than any other activity. The Church in her wisdom seeks to encourage living a good Christian life along with receiving the sacraments. Some actions are better for this than others so the Church attaches indulgences to some of these actions.

To gain an indulgence, the person must have at least a general intention of doing so, must exclude all attachment to sin, even venial sin, and perform the indulgenced act. Three more conditions are required: sacramental confession, Eucharistic communion and prayer for the pope's intentions (*one Our Father and one Hail Mary is enough, but other prayers may be said.*)

The Church's teachings are a great blessing to us. We need to learn and practice them to gain their benefit.
