
What's Happening? IN OUR PARISH AND THE CHURCH

Year of Faith Pope Benedict XVI has declared a Year of Faith to coincide with the 50th Anniversary of the start of the Second Vatican Council, which ran from 1962 to 1965, and calls on Catholics to renew their faith and to take time to study and grow in understanding the Scriptures. As a faith community, the Parish Council encourages you to participate. Our parish will be offering two "A Sunday Scripture Reading/Reflection Study Group/Groups". The purpose is to study, reflect on, and discuss the coming Sunday Scriptures in order to gain a deeper understanding of the readings and to prepare and participate better in the Sunday Liturgy. Decide to make this Lenten season a special time to "grow in faith."

Bring your Bible and join us at one of the following groups on either Friday mornings: 10:15-11:15 am in the Education Building or Wednesday evenings: 7:00–8:00 pm in the Community Center. Come as often as you can.

Liturgical Season

LENT As we all know, Lent is the period of 40 days that precede Easter in the church calendar. It is marked by simplicity, an effort to strip away the frills that we take too much for granted. The church is plain of decoration and the liturgies may be marked by reflective and unadorned music and prayer. Traditionally, choirs may cut back on instrumentation and elaborate harmonies during this time. By observing the 40 days of Lent, we aim to replicate Jesus Christ's sacrifice and withdrawal into the desert for 40 days.

The season of Lent 2013 begins Ash Wednesday, February 13. Sangre de Cristo will have masses at 9:15 am, 12:15 pm (lunchtime) and 5:30 pm.

Lent runs from Ash Wednesday until the Triduum commences Holy Thursday, March 28. During Lent there will be Stations of the Cross at 6:00 pm each Friday. A simple meal of soup may be shared from 5:00 to 5:45 pm right beforehand.

PASSION SUNDAY & HOLY WEEK Passion or Palm Sunday is the week before Easter and celebrates Christ's entry into Jerusalem and the subsequent events. We follow the normal Mass schedule: 5:30 pm Saturday, March 23; 8:30 am, 10:30 am & 6:00 pm Sunday, March 24.

TRIDUUM As Easter approaches we celebrate the Paschal Triduum, the three days that lead up to the Easter feast. These three days mark events crucial to Christian life. The Holy Thursday service may include the symbolic "Washing of the Feet" with members of the congregation standing (or sitting) in as disciples prepared to receive and continue the message of Christ. Holy Thursday liturgy will be at 6:00 pm.

On Good Friday there is no actual Mass, but services of Veneration and Distribution of Holy Communion will be held at 3:00 pm and 6:00 pm. The 6:00 pm service will feature live Stations of the Cross by members of the Confirmation class.

EASTER The Easter Vigil, the very first Mass of Easter, is traditionally held at sundown on Easter Saturday, March 30. Our service will be at 7:00 pm. Easter will continue Sunday, March 31, with masses at 8:30 and 10:30 am. There is no 6:00 pm Mass on Easter. If you are an "owl" by nature, try and make it to the Easter Vigil!

The Easter Season lasts until Pentecost, May 19. —Dorothy Cole Domrzalski, The Liturgy Team
